

1) THE CUSTOMS OFFICERS' PATH TO CAPO DI FENO (4 hours return from the house) This is a lovely, easy walk.

From the house, it takes 45 minutes
by car to reach the start of the walk.



The start is just before the large car park at the jetty for the Sanguinaires Islands. 100 metres before that, on the right, there is a small road you can drive up, and you can park at the top (subject to availability). You then continue straight on foot and you will see the footpath on your right that follows the coastline.

This walk presents no technical or physical difficulties, though it does require a bit of stamina, particularly for children. The path is flat with very little elevation gain. Allow 2 hours and 15 minutes for the round trip.

Bring water and protect your head

It is a dirt track that requires no special equipment other than the essentials for any keen hiker. Proper walking shoes, bottles of water, and a cap or hat to protect against the sun are recommended on a route with little shade.

All in all, a lovely and accessible walk to enjoy with family or friends.

Through the maquis

On this coastal path cutting through the maquis, the flora and fauna are in their natural state. The maquis consists mainly of Montpellier rockroses, but also includes heather and hairy rockrose. More surprisingly, before reaching Capo di Feno, there are a few olive trees weathered by the winds.

Crossing the first beach

As a reward for your efforts, and weather permitting, you can take a shortcut via the small staircase on your left (in poor condition) that runs alongside the house and leads down to Saint-Antoine beach.

You then cross the beach and, on the other side, pass through the wooden gate; walk for another 10 minutes to reach Capo Di Feno beach

(two beach huts are open; avoid weekends to ensure you get a spot).

So don't forget to bring your swimsuit and towel to relax in the water, though bear in mind that you still have half the journey to go.

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
